Today's readings highlight the glory of Christ's ministry, which was foretold by the prophets and inclusive of all people. The crowds followed Jesus, seeking His teaching and His healing. We, too, are members of this body whom He shepherds; we are taught, fed, and healed. How can we pass on this joyful message of comfort to those around us?

LITURGY OF THE WORD

In the first reading, the Lord holds past leaders accountable for the scattering of God's people. Jeremiah prophesies the return from exile and restoration of a noble king. Paul shares the good news that through Christ Jesus, all people are reconciled to God and *have access in one Spirit to the father*. In the Gospel, Jesus and the Apostles seek to get away from the crowds and rest, but they cannot. Jesus' heart is *moved with pity for them, for they were like sheep without a shepherd*.

OHIO CATHOLIC BISHOPS REINSTATE MASS OBLIGATION

In light of improving circumstances, a reduction in infections, and more people being vaccinated, the Bishops of Ohio have decided that the general obligation to attend Mass on Sunday and Holy Days has been reinstated. As always, those who are ill, have significant health risk factors or care for someone who is immune-compromised or ill are exempt from attending Mass on Sunday and Holy Days as well as those who have significant fear or anxiety of contracting COVID-19 in a large group of people. An appropriate way for those to honor the Lord's Day is by viewing a broadcast of Sunday Mass. NOTE: Mass that is broadcast through various media, including livestream, is not intended as an alternative, nor does it fulfill the obligation for persons who are able to gather for a Sunday celebration and other Holy Days. They are intended for the sick, homebound, imprisoned, etc. who are unable to attend Mass in person. CTNY's Mass for shut-ins will continue to be broadcast.

HERE AT ST. STEPHEN:

Masks will not be required for those vaccinated, but if you feel more comfortable wearing one, you certainly may. For now, we will continue using the bins for the offertory, continue to offer a sign of peace without shaking hands, follow the Communion procedures we have been practicing, including lay ministers and Father using hand sanitizer before distributing the Eucharist. Also, for now, Father will not shake hands after Mass. While we want things to get back to normal, we also want to be cautious as we see how everything plays out. We will make adjustments as we can. We ask for your patience and understanding as we begin to assemble again.
