THEME: OUR TRUE HOME IS HEAVEN. Today's Solemnity of All Saints Day celebrates all the unknown saints in heaven. By honoring them this day, we are reminded that our true home is heaven and that we, too, can become saints. For this to come about, we must love Jesus above all things, pray daily, be nourished by the graces of the sacraments, live according to the teachings of Jesus and persevere in faith.

LITURGY OF THE WORD: The first reading from the Book of Revelation offers a majestic vision of the great multitude of the saints in heaven. The second reading tells of the great love the Father has bestowed upon us, that we may be called the children of God. In the Gospel, Jesus teaches the eight beatitudes, which outline the essential virtues necessary for living a life of authentic discipleship.

FAMILY PERSPECTIVE: In a family, children are taught to be respectful if they want to be respected, to share if they want their fair share, and to listen if they want to be heard. Family life rescues us from arrogance by teaching us to love others as we love ourselves.

STEWARDSHIP THOUGHT "Blessed are the poor in spirit, for theirs is the kingdom of heaven." (Matthew 5:3)

"Poor in spirit" is confusing for many of us. It simply means to place your trust in God, putting His will first and being strong in faith. As we celebrate the lives of the saints on All Saints Day, remember, we too are called to be saints. Dialing down our own pride and ego and turning up the humility will help us on our path to sainthood.

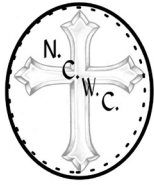
