A MESSAGE FROM FR. KORDA: I had my two full days of pre-op on Thursday and Friday, November 19 and 20. Both days were filled with diagnostic testing, X-rays, blood work, meeting with several doctors and the surgeon, all in preparation for my surgery on Monday, November 30. The surgeon was very pleased with the fact that my symptoms mimic the actual prognosis of the MRI findings. In other words, the back surgery is fairly straightforward. It is called a bi-lateral decompression whereby he trims the herniated disc, along with cutting the ligaments and possible cysts which are pressing on the nerves that have resulted in my leg pains. He believes that the surgery will work well for me. He reminded me, as did all of the other doctors and personnel that I met with at the Laser Spine Institute, to get plenty of rest for a total of eight to twelve weeks post-surgery. That is exactly what I intend to do. I will let you know how my surgery goes in next week's bulletin. Thank you for your cards and prayers for a successful surgery. Fr. Korda.
